Myanmar Mission Trip 2009

Inspiring, awesome, revealing - would aptly describe the experiences we had during the mission trip to Myanmar on March 25-April 4, 2009. God blessed the mission trip in a variety of ways that we didn't even imagine. The Lord provided Bring Good News with sufficient resources to assist 5 Christian churches in the Kachin State (northern Myanmar) and to 4 unreached people groups at 6 villages in Shan State (central east of Myanmar).

It's inspiring. Addressing the health issues in the villages outside Myitkyina, in Kachin State, we were able to provide 200 plastic toilets and 4 feet tubes to 200 Christian families to improve the sanitary disposal of waste. We also gave medicine for malaria victims, other basic medicine, and 40 mosquito nets. Moreover, we provided funds to renovate a 30 year old church building which was infested with termites. The church leaders know that every good and perfect gift came from above (James 1:17) and they were very grateful for answered prayers.

It's awesome. To the unreached groups in Shan State, the medical team was able to served 1,118 patients at 6 villages with a population of 1,848 people. In addition, we distributed 110 mosquito nets, 100 blankets, and funds to complete community projects - purchase hydro dynamo to restore electric supply to 28 Danu tribe families; a new electric generator and dynamo to give electric power to 80 Tha Nuk families; and building materials to construct a children's school.

It's revealing. There are encouraging signs that show that God is working and is being glorified. 1) A brother from the Danu tribe was baptized last February and wants to attend Bible College. 2) Ten families from the Ngwe Palaung are asking our evangelists to teach them about the Christian faith. Three families have already accepted Jesus as their savior. We gave them portable radios so they can listen daily to a Christian program in Burmese. 3) A door has been opened for a Lisu tribe in northern part of Shan State to become Christians. The government offered to transfer the Lisu with the LaHu tribe (mostly Christians) to a new site by the end of the year. One of our evangelists will be teaching the Lisu about Jesus Christ. Please pray for the Lisu tribe.

If you wish, I'll be delighted to do a mission presentation of our Myanmar trip to encourage your church to more active involvement in the Great Commission.
